The Ag in the Classroom Program provides resources to teachers to help K-12 grade students understand the importance of agriculture.

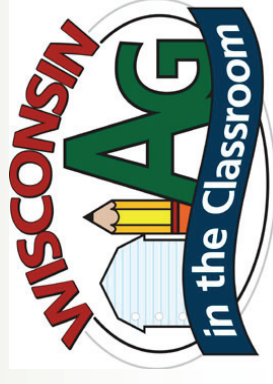

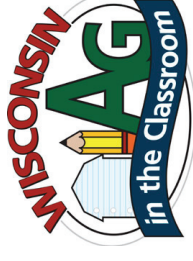
