I recently had the opportunity to travel to Washington, D.C. with the Farm Bureau Institute class. Two things continue to impress me. Recently, the EPA made a ruling redefining "waters of the U.S." under the Clean Water Act. This ruling has grossly overreached the regulator authority of the EPA to many ditches and farmland. Although the EPA has offered an exemption for agriculture, I believe the EPA doesn't have the authority to offer such an exemption. If we accept this authority at this point, we also would have to except it if the EPA removed the exemption. Please contact your representative and senators to tell them how such an overreach would affect you on your farm. Representative Petri recently announced his retirement. I want to express my gratitude to him for his years of service to his district and to this country. I encourage everyone to have discussions with the candidates and vet how they will protect our rights as land owners.

I also want to personally thank everyone who has been involved in the strategic planning process. It is an important part of developing and prioritizing the future of our organization. A major part of the future and a way to also save Farm Bureau money is by using more electronic communications. In order to do this we must have your email addresses. #### Extension Update - Farm Technology Days 2014

Held in a different Wisconsin county each year since 1954, Farm Technology Days is a non-profit, educational event intended to showcase the cutting-edge of agriculture products and practices. Hosted by family farms, the event appeals to large scale agriculture and hobby farmers alike. This three day event traditionally draws 40,000 to 80,000 attendees.

Portage County host farms are Blue Top Farms, a 1,200 acre grain and vegetable farm and Feltz Family Farms, a 550-cow dairy located east of Plover's Crossroad Commons, south of Highway HH. Additional land, being used for field demonstrations, is being made possible through neighboring potato and vegetable growers; Myron Soik and Sons, Inc. and Greg Kizewski and Sons, Inc.

To further showcase potato farming in Central Wisconsin, the commemorative toy collectible for 2014 is a one-of-a-kind, limited edition 2000 Lenco Self Propelled Airhead Potato Harvester. Only 1,000 of the toys (1:42 scale, die-cast metal) will be produced. These potato harvesters will be sold exclusively through the 2014 Portage County Farm Technology Days organization. This is a must have especially if you have any connections to the potato industry at all. #### **WFBF Women's Committee Collect Pop Tabs for Ronald McDonald House**

In 2013 the WFBF Women's Committee and volunteers from their districts came together to help in a one day project at the Ronald McDonald Houses in Madison, Milwaukee and Marshfield. The committee and volunteers cooked and served meals, provided games and crafts for the children and donated food, books, toys, clothing and monetary donations. This year the committee will once again conduct this project in all three houses in addition to a Pop Tab Challenge.



What is a pop tab? Pop tabs are the little aluminum tabs from all kinds of cans: soda, some pet food, canned fruits, vegetables and more.

How do pop tabs help the Ronald McDonald House? Once the pop tabs are collected and turned into a Ronald McDonald House, they are taken to be recycled in exchange for dollars, which support the children and families staying at the Ronald McDonald Houses.

The pop tab challenge is a statewide project which began in January and will run through November with the final collection of tabs from each district being dropped at the WFBF Annual Meeting trade show at the Kalahari Resort in Wisconsin Dells this December 6-8. The women's booth at the trade show will have nine tubs labeled District 1-9. Attendees are asked to drop their collection in their district's tub.

- 5. How should our nation's policies balance concerns about food insecurity against concerns about the safety or environmental impact of modern agricultural technologies? What role should farmers have in discussing and debating these issues in our society and with our lawmakers?
