Washington County Farm Bureau 2020 Scholarship Guidelines

Washington County Farm Bureau is making five (5) - \$750 scholarships available to students who will be furthering in higher or continued education and to those who meet the qualifications listed below. **Recipients must also work a four-hour food stand shift during the July 2020 county fair** (exceptions may be made). Contact Mariann Gundrum at 262.483.5114 by **July 1.**

Qualifications

- Scholarships will only be awarded to students of families who have Washington County Farm Bureau memberships. Applicants 22 years of age or older must have their own membership.
- The scholarship may be used at any accredited technical school or university for continuing education in agriculture or an agricultural-related field.
- Considerations will be given to non-agricultural field related applications; however, preference will be given to those that are agriculturally related.
- The Scholarship Committee will base its selection upon:
 - o Extra curricular activities (4-H, FFA, school, community, full- or part-time employment).
 - o Two letters of recommendation.
 - o Transcript of high school grades (seniors).
 - o Transcript of higher or continued education grades (if applicable).
- Scholarships will be awarded at the recommendation of the Scholarship Committee.
 Recipients will be notified by Friday, May 8. A small awards presentation will be conducted on WTKM Radio on Saturday, July 25, during the Washington County Fair.
- If no worthy candidate is found, the Scholarship Committee reserves the right to withhold the scholarship(s).
- Payment of scholarships will be made to the recipient(s) after his or her first term of the current year and after he or she has submitted a copy of his or her semester grade transcript showing a 2.5 (C+) grade point average or better (due by **Friday, January 29, 2021**).

The application form must be filled out and submitted to the Scholarship Committee by Friday, April 17, along with your essay and two letters of recommendation*.

*References shall return their written recommendations to the Farm Bureau office in a sealed envelope. (Examples: 4-H leaders, principals, teachers/advisors, local community leaders, employers).
